A large number of individuals involved in school and other shootings were either on prescription drugs or coming off them. Some experts wonder if an added cause of violence is the drugs themselves.

In the last five decades, more than 20 anti-psychotics and 30 anti-depressants have been marketed with over \$25 billion in sales in the U.S. in 2011 alone. That's a lot of drugs, and the habit of resorting to prescribing drugs is rising rapidly.

"The Japanese for example had a noble respect for this thing that we call depression.
